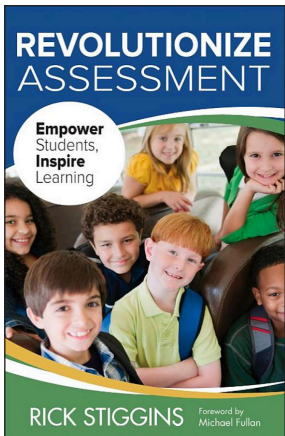




Revolutionize Assessment

In this text, Rick Stiggins outlines why it is imperative that we think of assessment in new and different ways than we have in the past, as the role and use of assessments have expanded in our educational context. He also stresses the critical importance of a clear foundational understanding of assessment literacy practices for all educators and administrators that helps support and certify

learning, engaging students as partners in the process.
